4 things you need to do now to move ahead with your ASU enrollment

1. Check your email and MyASU for time-sensitive notifications

Log into MyASU to review Priority Tasks, take care of finances, get information on your academic department, etc. Your ASU email address is not active until shortly before classes start, so make sure your "forwarding email" is set to a personal account that you access often.

Top tip

Don't forget to download and print/save your admit letter, which is available on MyASU, so you have it for travel to the USA.

2. Pay your university enrollment deposit

Pay a \$250 university enrollment deposit to confirm your spot at ASU. You may need to wait 48 hours after submitting the deposit to begin your next steps toward enrollment. Students admitted to the W. P. Carey School of Business pay a \$500–\$1,000 program enrollment deposit instead.

Top tip

Online payments can be made through MyASU (see "My Admission and Orientation" box). Only Visa or MasterCard debit and credit cards are accepted.

3. Request your I-20 so you can apply for a visa

Follow the actions on your I-20 tracker within MyASU. The steps include filling out the financial guarantee form, providing bank statements (or sponsor letter for sponsored students) and uploading a copy of your passport.

Top tip

MyASU only allows the upload of each document type once, so make sure your financial documents show sufficient funding prior to uploading.

4. Schedule an appointment with your academic advisor

You can find the name, email, and phone number for your academic advisor in the Academic Support Team box on MyASU. Click on the Academic Advisor option there to find this contact information and schedule your appointment. They will help you register for courses.

Top tip

Note that you may have a hold on your enrollment that will need to be completed before registering for classes.
