
Honors Thesis: A year-long project under the guidance of a faculty director focusing on an area of academic, professional or personal interest.

Application guide

1. Apply to ASU

Submit your ASU application via admission.asu.edu/kaplan/asu-apply. After applying, activate your ASURITE UserID and password. We recommend applying to ASU at least 4 weeks before your preferred Barrett admissions deadline.

2. Apply to Barrett

Start the Barrett application as soon as you have your ASURITE UserID - no need to wait for ASU admission. Find our free application at: barretthonors.asu.edu/admissions.

Application items



Letters of recommendation

Two letters are required and at least one must be academic. Letters are uploaded to the application by recommenders.



Beyond the classroom

Share up to ten activities that are meaningful to you. For example: hobbies, leadership roles, jobs, organizations through your school or community, volunteer work, awards, etc.



Essay response to chosen prompt

Visit the Barrett website to find tips on how to address the essay. Be sure to have someone proofread your essay before submission.



Optional

Our application includes optional spaces to provide additional information about your academic record and/or submit a creative supplement.



Academic information

There is no minimum GPA for admission to Barrett. Your unofficial transcript and course rigor will be taken into consideration.

Application submission deadlines

To move into review, a Barrett application must be both submitted and complete by one of the deadlines below. Student notification dates for each of the deadlines can be found on our website.

Early Action	Regular Decision	Late Consideration

3. Monitor your application

After submission, track the status of your application through the Barrett Application Status area of your MyASU homepage.

4. Confirm your spot in Barrett

Address the ASU enrollment deposit by May 1 to confirm your spot with Barrett.
