Get a head start on your university degree in high school

ASU Prep Digital is an accredited online US high school, where you can study anywhere in the world and in your own time zone. You can enroll in a full-time US diploma program, a dual diploma alongside your local high school studies, or take individual university courses. All you need is an internet connection.

U.S. high school diploma

Experience a U.S. education and prepare for university admission from the convenience of your own home. As an accredited high school, ASU Prep Digital offers students the opportunity to earn a full-time U.S. high school diploma remotely. All courses are taught completely online, making it a fully flexible option — you can work where you want, on your own schedule, using adaptive learning technology. Key facts

Level: grades 9-12.

Intakes: Fall, Spring and Summer, with multiple start dates per semester.

Tuition: \$750 per 0.5 credit course. (1 high school course = 0.5 credits).

Program structure: typically 6 (0.5 credit) courses per semester and approximately 30 hours per week engaged in study. The standard course length is 16–18 weeks.

Graduation requirements: you must complete 4 years of English and mathematics, 3 years of lab sciences and social sciences, 2 years of foreign language and 1 year of fine arts and other electives.

English proficiency: you need an adequate level to fully participate in English-taught courses. To take university courses, students should have TOEFL 61, though some courses may have higher score requirements.

Required documents for admission: application form (link below), high school transcript (with translation if original is not in English), transcript evaluation form.

Dual diploma

International students can earn a U.S. high school diploma, in addition to their local secondary school qualification, by completing courses through ASU Prep Digital. You'll have access to the same world-class online learning systems, personal Learning Success Coach, and university-level courses as the full-time diploma.

Key facts

Level: grades 9-12.

Intakes: Fall, Spring and Summer, with multiple start dates per semester.

Tuition: from \$9,000 for the entire program.

Program structure: at least 12 (0.5 credit) courses with ASU Prep Digital studied for a minimum of 1 year, but it may be longer if you need to take more credits. Typical course loads include 2 English courses, 2 history courses, and 2 elective courses.

Graduation requirements: at least 22 total secondary school credits (a minimum of 6 must be through ASU Prep Digital) with 60%+ final grade in all courses.

English proficiency: level 3 "expanding" (730+) on the TOEFL Junior Assessment is recommended.

Required documents for admission: application form (link below), high school transcript (with translation if original is not in English), transcript evaluation form.

Part-time university courses

High school students can enroll in individual courses through ASU Prep Digital and earn undergraduate credits. The credit is transferable to ASU degrees and other US universities.

There are more than 200 ASU courses available at significantly reduced tuition. Part-time study while you are in high school will give you an accelerated path toward university admission and careers of the future.

Key facts

Level: undergraduate study while enrolled in high school.

Intakes: Fall, Spring and Summer, with multiple start dates per semester.

Tuition: up to \$1,000 per 3-credit course.

Study time: up to 18 hours per week per course (1 or 2 courses per semester).

Minimum English score: TOEFL 61 or equivalent.

Required documents for admission: application form (link below), Letter of Recommendation from your school stating that you are ready to take college courses.
