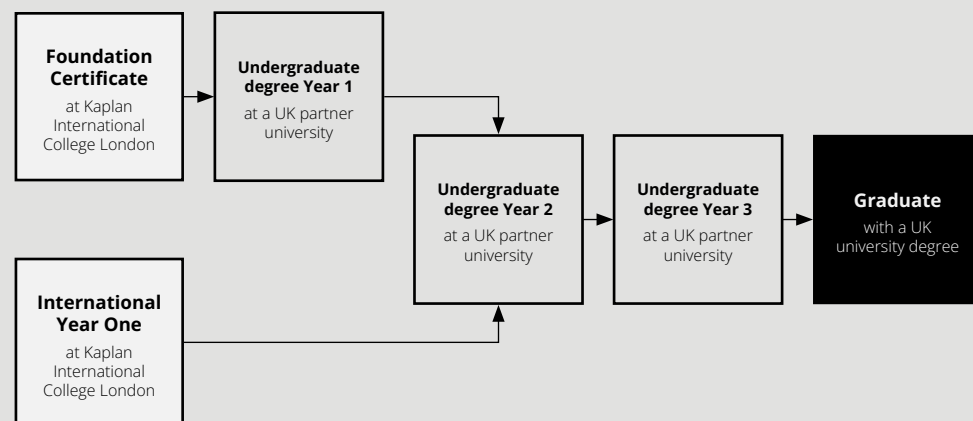
### Course delivery

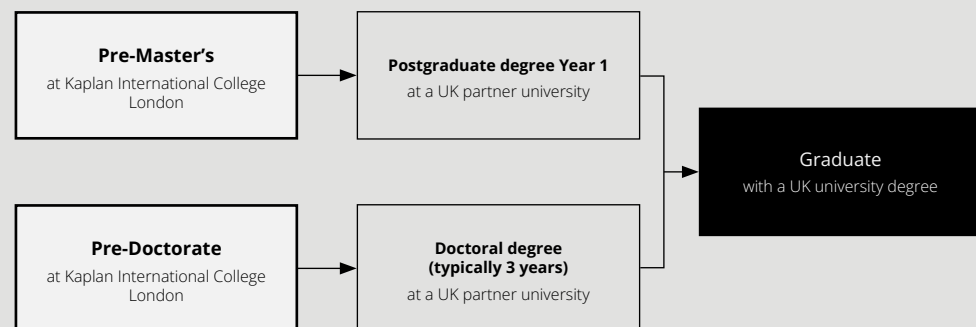
