

Pace University academic scholarships 2025–26

Merit scholarships give international students who exhibit academic promise a helping hand with the cost of their Pace University degree.



Direct admission merit scholarships

Students joining a Pace degree will be considered for a scholarship at the time of their admission. No separate application is required. Renewal each year is automatic, provided the student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA and continuous full-time enrollment for each Fall and Spring semester.

Degree admission to a bachelor's program (first-year entry)

- The award is based on a student's grade in secondary school study.
- No SAT or ACT score is required to be eligible for scholarships.
- The award is applicable only to Fall and Spring semester bachelor's program tuition charges at Pace. Summer semester is not included.
- Scholarships are available for a maximum of 4 years. The exception is students enrolled in an approved 5-year combined degree program who may receive the award for up to 5 years.

Please note: actual awards will be determined after Pace's full review of an application and GPA calculation. If a student submits an SAT or ACT score, it will affect the amount awarded, depending on the score. Applicants planning on submitting SAT/ACT scores are advised to use Pace's merit calculator: admission.pace.edu/register/merit

Admitted students are considered for scholarships within these ranges, each year:

Undergraduate scholarships:

Up to \$144,000 at Westchester Campus and \$84,000 at New York City Campus (maximum award over 4 years).

Transfer admission to a bachelor's program

- Students are evaluated based on cumulative GPAs from current and/ or previous colleges/ universities.
- The award is applicable only to Fall and Spring semester bachelor's program tuition charges at Pace. Summer semester is not included.
- Scholarships are available each academic year until degree completion.

Admitted students are considered for scholarships within these ranges, each year:

Degree admission to a master's program

- The amount depends on a student's GPA and achievement in their bachelor's degree, and which academic college and program they apply for.
- Students with GPA 3.3+ are most likely to be awarded a scholarship.
- Awards are deducted from the master's program tuition.

Admitted students may be awarded a scholarship within this range, each year:

Pathway program progression to the Westchester Campus

- Students who successfully complete Undergraduate Global Pathways are eligible for a bachelor's tuition scholarship if they choose to study for at least 2 semesters on Pace's Westchester Campus.
- The award is based on a student's GPA during the Global Pathways Program and the size of the matriculating class.
