Undergraduate pathway program leads to Pace University's School of Education



Undergraduate Global Pathways—School of Education track

This program can help you to improve your English language, academic grades, and study skills, so you can progress to a bachelor's degree at the School of Education. You will also earn credits that transfer to your degree to ensure you graduate on time. If you already meet all the entry requirements for the degree, you can apply for direct admission.

Progression degrees

The Undergraduate Global Pathways program leads to one of the following bachelor's degrees and the New York State Initial Teaching Certificate for the level you plan to teach.

Early Childhood Education, BS

Learn to support young children from birth to grade 2.

Early Childhood and Childhood Education, BS

Learn to support young learners from birth through grade 6.

Childhood Education, BS

For teaching grades 1–6. Choose one of the following concentrations: biology*, English, history, mathematics*, or Spanish.

Adolescent Education, BS

For teaching middle and high school students (grades 7–12) in one of the following subjects: biology*, chemistry, English, history, mathematics*, or Spanish.

Combined bachelor's and master's options

In this 5 year program, Adolescent Education, BS or Early Childhood and Childhood Education, BS can be combined with Special Education, MSEd or Literacy, MSEd.
