The **Honors First Year Experience** classes offer you an intimate class experience and connection to some of UConn's best faculty.

It is an introduction to your Honors education, with a learning environment of critical thinking, problem solving, and discussion.

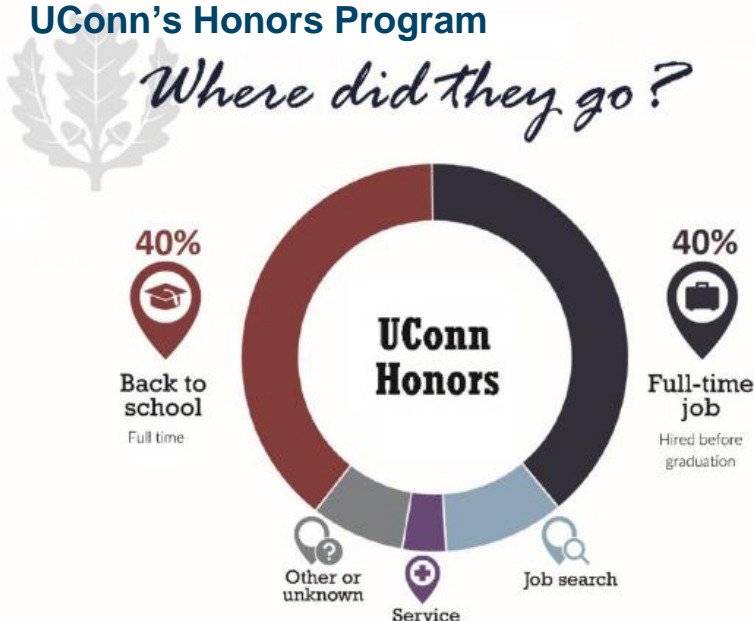
The **Honors Core** is a set of **courses** in interdisciplinary studies connected to real-world problems.

Honors Core courses are taught in small groups and are designed to push you to question your assumptions about knowledge and the world around you.

You will be placed in an **Honors First-Year Residential Community**, where students live, study, learn, and grow together.

Living in Honors Housing can jumpstart your academic success and personal development.

Honors Program admissions

Entering first-years are invited to join the Honors Program. Offers are made at the time of UConn admission based on a holistic review of your application.

- Apply to UConn by December 1 for priority consideration for invitation to Honors Program
- All first-year applicants for UConn Storrs and UConn Stamford are automatically considered for admission to the Honors Program
- Holistic review considerations include rigor of high school curriculum, GPA, class rank, co-curricular activities, SAT/ACT (optional), essays, and letters of recommendation (optional)
- Other opportunities for admission: apply after your first or second year at any UConn campus
