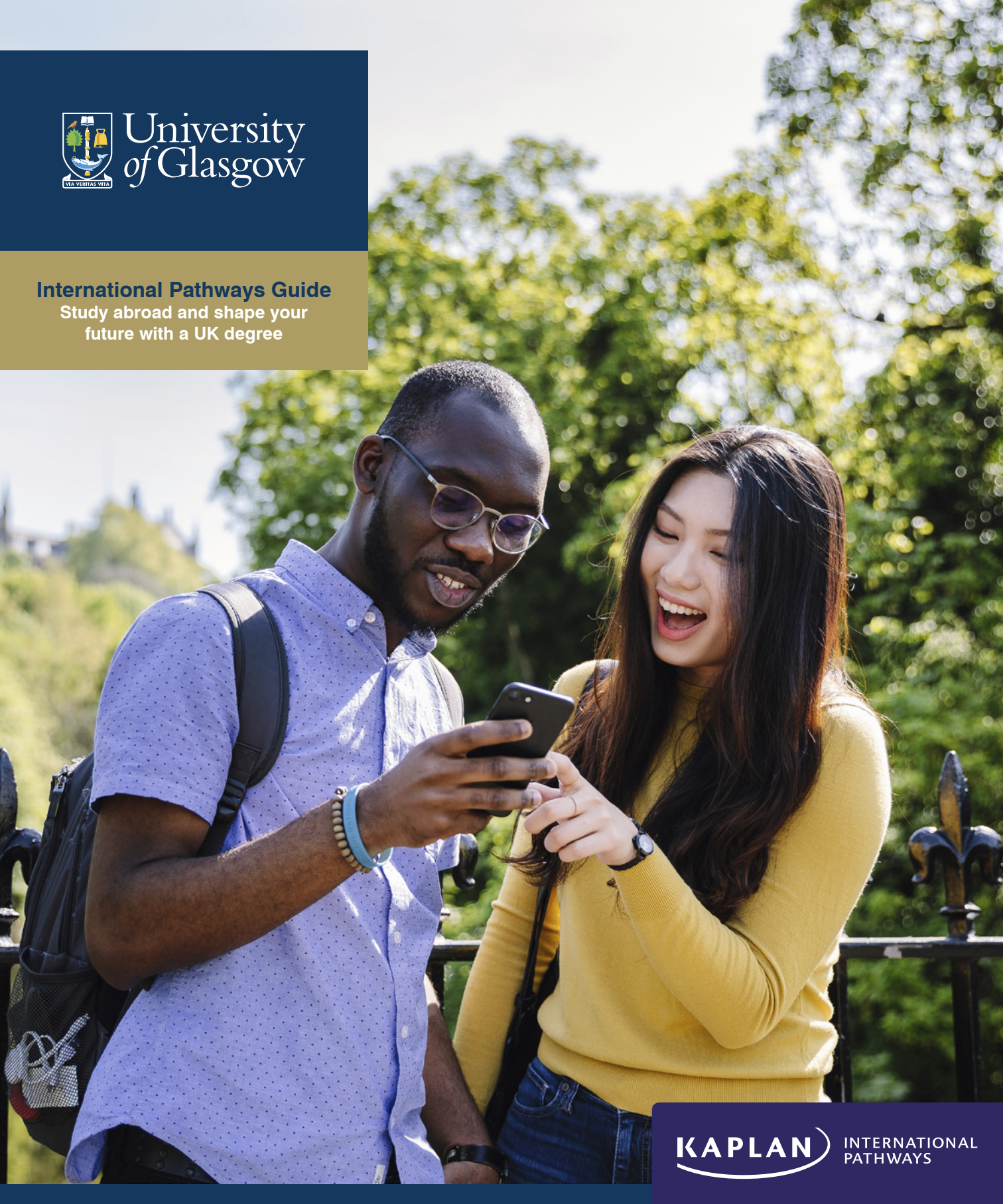

THE UNIVERSITY OF GLASGOW IS SPREAD ACROSS THREE CAMPUSES, AND IS KNOWN FOR ITS BEAUTIFUL, STRIKING ARCHITECTURE. IT MAY LOOK LIKE A FAIRYTALE CASTLE, BUT THE UNIVERSITY IS HOME TO STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITIES AND A VIBRANT, MULTICULTURAL STUDENT POPULATION.

The University of Glasgow has a long history, and its campus environment reflects this, with its Gothic buildings and grassy courtyard. But don't be fooled: this is a modern University with cutting-edge facilities. A recent £1 billion investment is one of the most significant by a UK university for decades, and is most visible in the new James McCune Smith Learning Hub. Other academic facilities include a huge library with over 2.5 million books, several computer centres across the three campuses, and an array of science labs, lecture theatres and study spaces.

There are plenty of sports and social amenities as well. You can keep active with an ultramodern gym, all-weather sports pitches and courts, and a six-lane swimming pool. 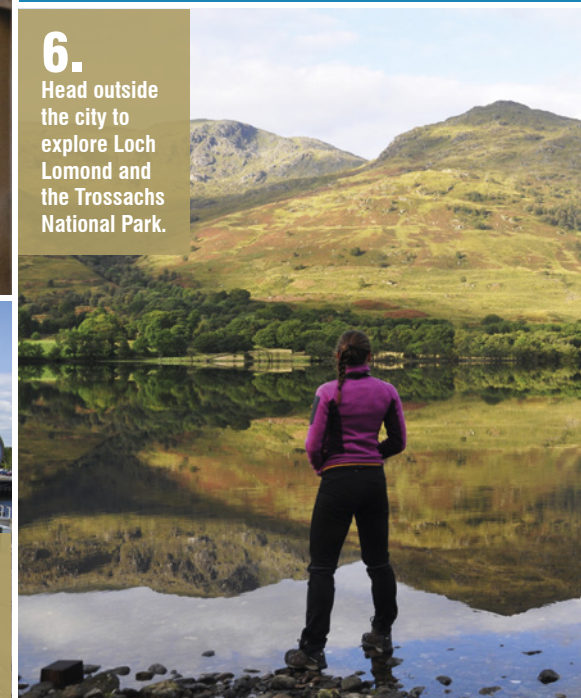

ACCOMMODATION IN GLASGOW

Kaplan Living Glasgow

Old Dumbarton Road

This residence is just a five-minute walk from the College and University campus. You'll live with other students in a shared flat with private bedrooms and bathrooms and shared kitchens. The residence also has social rooms with a TV and games tables, so you can relax and socialise with your new friends. It's also where you'll stay if you're under 18.

Argyle Street

At this student residence, you'll be a ten-minute walk from the International College and University campus. Here you'll stay in a shared flat with a private bedroom and bathroom and communal kitchen, making life comfortable and convenient. You'll have access to the facilities at Old Dumbarton Road nearby, as well as the many shops and restaurants in the lively West End.

Note: due to the popularity of our accommodation, we may find you a third party residence; you will be advised at the time of booking.

When you book with Kaplan, you'll get:

- dedicated booking and post-arrival support
- a private bedroom and bathroom, or a private studio
- a shared or private kitchen per flat
- all bills, maintenance and WiFi included

Take a pathway course

As an international student, you might need, or benefit from, a pathway course before you start a degree. A pathway course is often necessary because of differences between the UK's education system and that of your home country. It will boost your academic and language skills, and improve your subject knowledge to the level needed for entry to a degree at the University.

You'll take the course at Glasgow International College, before you start your degree. The College's experienced teaching and support staff will make sure you are on the right path throughout your course, and will help you develop the skills and knowledge you need for your degree. When you pass your course at the required level, and with good attendance, you'll be guaranteed entry to your degree!

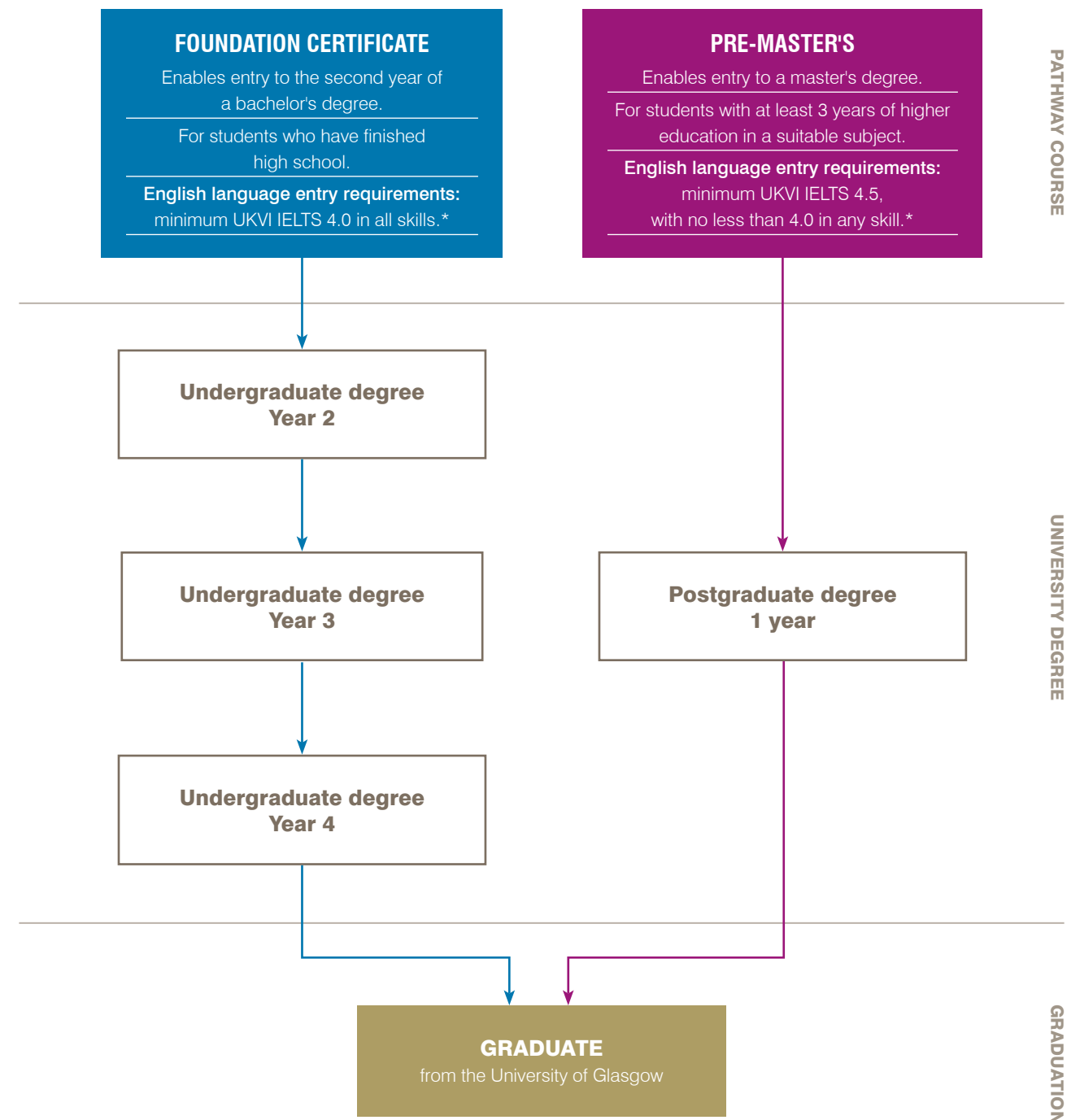
Scottish education system

Undergraduate degrees in Scotland typically last four years, rather than the three years you would usually study at a university in England or Wales. As an international student, you can progress straight to the second year of a bachelor's degree at the University of Glasgow by taking the Foundation Certificate. You'll then have three years to complete before you graduate.

MEET MARYCARMEN

MARYCARMEN FROM VENEZUELA FOLLOWED HER PATH FROM GLASGOW INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE TO A BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING DEGREE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GLASGOW. THIS IS HER STORY.

“At first I wasn’t planning on studying abroad, and then I thought about studying in the USA. But my friend from Venezuela told me it would be better to move here to the UK. She said it was less expensive, more flexible and closer to everything. In Venezuela, most people want to study in the USA, but I like the University of Glasgow. When I got here I fell in love with it, it looks so cool, like it’s from Harry Potter or something!

You receive so much help from the staff when you arrive here in Glasgow... they guide you through each step of the process, and if you feel bad you can always talk to them about it. They keep it private if it’s a personal problem; they’re very trustworthy.

My time at the University wasn’t too different from my time at the International College; the timetables were similar. Each year at the University we had individual projects, just like at the International College. At the College I designed a can crusher as an engineering project, and at University I designed an inhaler for Biomedical Engineering, and for General Engineering you also have to design a bike.

In my final year we did a hand project, like a bionic hand. The hand moved according to my own; it basically simulated it. I felt really engaged with these kinds of projects. When I was deciding where to study, and I spoke to someone from Kaplan, they told me about these projects, like a mechanical hand that runs on solar power, and I was really impressed.

My advice for students considering their study options is to just not be afraid. Studying abroad will be an experience, and you don’t know what is going to happen. You just need to put yourself out into the world!

Now, I have a first-class degree and I’m excited for what the future holds.
