### Do many UO international students work on campus?

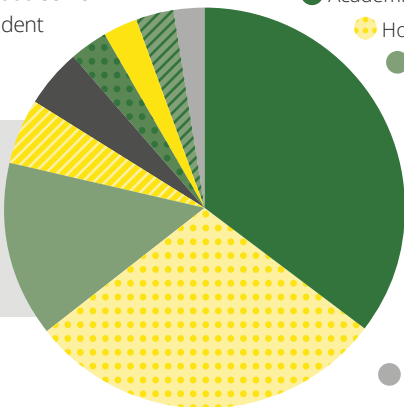
Yes! In fact, 85% of UO international students worked on campus in 2024.

## Help for international students to find an on-campus job

Every Fall, the University Career Center holds a Part-Time Job Fair where employers look for new hires. You don't have to wait until you arrive to start looking for a job though — you can activate your free Handshake account and apply for jobs before you even leave your home country!

## Work-study award

You may be eligible for a work-study award from UO. This program enables students with financial need to earn money towards their study expenses with an on-campus job. Some on-campus positions are reserved especially for students with a work-study award, which means it can be easier to find employment.

Please note, international students can work up to 20 hours a week during the academic term and 40 hours during breaks. If you have more than one employer, the maximum applies to the combined total hours worked in all jobs.
