

Tips for a successful US Visa interview

Important to understand: Visa officers are trained to assume you intend to stay in the USA: it's up to you to prove otherwise. The interview will last no more than two minutes. Visa officers often decide whether to approve or deny a visa within 45 seconds, so your attitude and answers are key.



Know your university

and program, including the curriculum and any specializations



Know your finances and how you will cover US study and living costs



Know your career plans and the outcomes of your intended degree

DO	DON'T
Apply for university I-20s as early as possible	Submit any false documents
Pay attention when filling out the DS160 visa application: if in doubt, ask for help	Complete the visa forms incorrectly
Give clear answers that contain information about your decision making process, especially why you chose this university	Conceal information or provide incorrect information during the visa interview
Remember you will be interviewed by an American, so it's important to be positive, confident and make genuine eye contact	Ask Al chatbots what to say in visa interviews — sounding scripted will lead to a visa denial
Be natural in your answers and authentic with your study intentions	Use an answer that sounds generic or memorize irrelevant stats
